Cashiers

- Cashiers (pronounced CASH-ers)
- Our cool summers and fabulous seasons give everyone something to look forward to throughout the year. (Average Summer High 76/Average Winter High 42)
- Land of waterfalls (19 waterfalls throughout terrain)
- Whitewater Falls is the highest falls east of the Rockies with 411 ft drop
- Visitors find peaceful valleys, sparkling lakes and rivers, cool summer breezes, majestic scenery, lush green forests and native flora and fauna throughout the year.
- Recreational amenities are numerous and include such outdoor activities as golf, tennis, horseback riding, boating, rafting, fishing, swimming, hiking and cycling.
- Favorite scenic drives are through the Cullasaga Gorge; Horse Cove to the Chattooga River; through Whiteside Cove, and to the overlooks on the Blue Ridge Parkway at Blue Valley and Devil's Courthouse.
- Whiteside Mountain is one of the oldest mountains on Earth.
- 41 past or present Fortune 500 "Chiefs" have a residence here.
- At an elevation of 3,485 feet, the small town of Cashiers anchors the surrounding area of Lake Glenville, Sapphire and Lake Toxaway.
- Only 70 miles from Asheville NC and Greenville/Spartanburg SC
- Under 240 miles from Charlotte NC, Atlanta GA, Columbia SC, Knoxville TN, and Chattanooga TN.
- Under 350 miles from Birmingham AL, Lexington KY, and Raleigh NC.
- Under 800 miles from Sarasota, Orlando, and W. Palm/Boca Raton FL
- Favorite scenic drives include the Cullasaga Gorge, Horse Cove to the Chattooga River, Whiteside Mountain (one of the oldest mountain on Earth), the world-famous Blue Ridge Parkway, and much, much more
- The western North Carolina area has so much to offer including peaceful valleys, sparkling lakes and rivers, cool summers, majestic scenery, lush forests, native flora and indigenous wildlife

Lake Glenville

- In 1940 the west fork of the Tuckasegee River was dammed and used by ALCOA (Aluminum Company of America) for electricity to make aluminum for WW2 efforts.
- It encompassed the entire valley north of Cashiers, flooding the town of Glenville including schools, homes, businesses, and farmlands to a depth of 300 feet.
- Highest elevation lake east of the Mississippi.
- 26 miles of white sand shoreline and tiny island throughout.
- 1470 Acres/ 6 miles long
- Has a wide variety of fishing from Walleye, Small Mouth Bass, Crappie, Bream and Trout.

- World Class fly fishing opportunities abound on four different rivers: Tuckasegee, Nantahala, Davidson, and Little Tennessee.

State Parks

- Panthertown Valley (a part of Nantahala National Forest) - This 6,300 acre backcountry area in Nantahala National Forest offers visitors a wide variety of places to explore and has become a popular destination for hikers, mountain bikers, equestrians, rock climbers, anglers, school groups, summer camps, scout troops, ornithologists, etc. (20 min.)
- Pisgah National Forest – With over 510,119 acres you will find an interest for almost everyone. Camping, picnicking, swimming, fishing, hunting, canoeing, rock climbing, rafting, tubing, nature studies, bird watching, or butterfly hunting, hiking, horseback, bicycle, ATV, and Auto trails will allow for the exploration of this awesome natural environment by people of all ages and abilities. (30 min.)
- Great Smoky Mountain National Park – This 500,000 Acre Park is split equally between NC & TN. From the big animals like bears, deer, and elk, down to microscopic organisms, the Smokies have the most biological diversity of any area in the world's temperate zone. The park is a sanctuary for a magnificent array of animal and plant life, all of which is protected for future generations to enjoy.
